The Caboolture Community Choir proudly entertained a sell-out crowd of over 100 friends, relatives, past choir members and lovers of music, honouring the Choir's 30 year anniversary. It was a fabulous event, topped off with a delicious afternoon tea catered by The Coffee Patch.

Two Choir members who were among the founding group and have remained committed for the full 30 years were honoured with gifts of flowers. The contributions of past members were also acknowledged, with particular note of the amazing efforts of Laurelle Olsson, the Choir's first Musical Director who led it for over 25 years, and stalwart John Horchner.

Commenting on the concert, John said, "How quickly the years go by when you are in the company of those who love to sing... This was a fabulous afternoon of memories, song and fellowship."

MP for Morayfield and Choir Patron, Mark Ryan, presented the choir with a special birthday gift: a magnificent painting of song birds by local artist, Chris Edwards. Mark applauded the choir as not just a singing group, but a vital part of the community. Mark's office was thanked for printing the lovely colour program brochures given to each attendee, detailing the choir's proud history with stories and photos.

The Choir is now planning its next chapter, and is seeking more folk who love to sing to join a wonderfully warm and welcoming choir family, committed to sharing the joy of music, and reaping the known health and well-being benefits of singing.
